

Landmark Case Seminar 2008-2009

This seminar is held on Tuesdays in the Bienville Bldg, ELMHS Campus, from Noon-1:00PM. This seminar is chaired by Clay Kelly, M.D., and covers the landmark cases designated by the American Academy of Psychiatry & the Law. Landmark Louisiana legal cases are also covered.

Fellows prepare a presentation of the cases leading into a discussion led by Dr. Kelly. John Thompson, Jr., M.D. provides continuity between the material discussed in Landmark Cases and forensic practice by highlighting the relevance of such cases to forensic evaluators. A staff attorney at ELMHS with a background in Mental Health Advocacy, Michelle Duncan, J.D. also attends seminars.

Fellows participate in a Landmark Case mid-term and final exam conducted by Drs. Kelly and Thompson. Fellows also have the opportunity to write a *Legal Digest* article for the AAPL Journal each year, and this seminar provides the basis for equipping fellows to do so.
